- Require routine health supervision



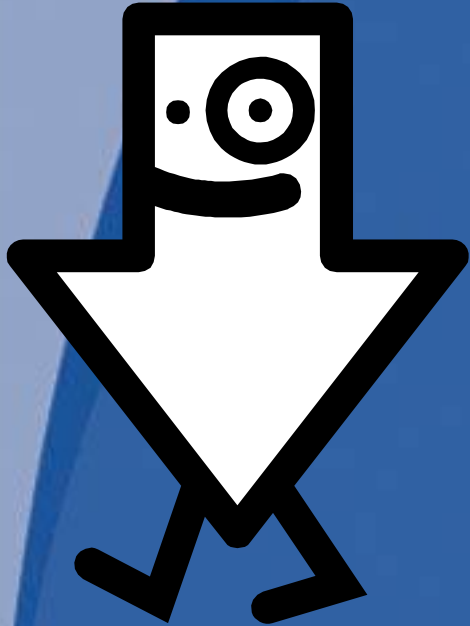
What are the Benefits?

What are the Benefits?



Reduced:

- Hospitalizations
 - Length of hospital stay
 - Use of emergency department services

What are the Benefits?

- Establishment of a forum for problem solving
- Efficient use of limited resources (AAP, 2005)





Children with Special Health Care Needs

“Those who have or are at increased risk for chronic physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional condition and who also require health and related services of a type or amount beyond that required by children generally”
(McPherson et al., 1998)



Common Barriers

- Confusion about WHO is responsible for health care of children
- Overburdened child care staff
- Difficulty navigating health care services and financing
- Limited availability of pediatric health services

Action Items for the CCHC

- Ensure credibility of the agency
- Maintain current records
- Establish link between child care staff and resources
- Ensure coordination with medical home
- Assist medical home provider in identifying resources



Action Items for the CCHC

- Educate child care staff and families
- Assist child care staff in maintaining a medical home resource list
- Be a liaison between medical home providers and child care staff
